AWR-135

AWR-135 provides participants an introduction to basic cybersecurity topics as well as the Community Cyber Security Maturity Model (CCSMM). Through the use of case studies, participants will examine the characteristics within each dimension of the CCSMM that facilitate becoming a cyber resilient community, as well as actions that are counterproductive to cyber resiliency.
